One of the greatest professional challenges facing educators today is to provide educational opportunities in a safe and welcoming environment while addressing student behavior. This workshop will focus on current issues of discipline and behavior and practical, functional options that can be used in the development and implementation of positive educational practice for all students. Approaching treatment on a problem-by-problem and classroom-wide basis, direct intervention strategies can be created that are individually or globally suitable. A child's response to matched behavioral intervention(s) could reduce, ameliorate, remediate or strengthen skills while approaching different children in different ways.

This workshop will also teach a 10 Step Behavior change process to help redefine, refocus, and re-evaluate your approach for dealing with disruptive behaviors. You will learn strategies that can be integrated into your classroom, leading to positive behavioral change for even the most challenging students.
