Effective intervention is the “heart and soul” of a successful RtI program. This workshop will explore exactly what the research says about literacy intervention in K-6 and how to apply this knowledge when designing a school wide intervention system across 3 or 4 Tiers of support, including Tier 1 General Education. Using demonstration, video clips, and modeling participants will learn the essential elements of effective intervention and explore various models for maximizing staff resources, choosing effective programs, and supporting classroom teachers in using programs with fidelity.
