LOCAL INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

The purpose of this agreement is to provide guidelines and working procedures for staff and designees of the Tulare County/District Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) and the Tulare County Children's Medical Services/California Children Services.

This agreement is entered into in order to provide a systematic, effective continuum of service options to students with exceptional needs, ages birth through twenty-one years, and their parents. The implementation of this agreement will ensure interagency coordination, the timely provision of services, and the effective utilization of agency resources to meet the needs of students with exceptional needs.

Special education services to individuals with disabilities are mandated by federal and state laws and regulations, including the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEIA) of 2004; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1998; the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) or 1990; The California Education Code and Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

Medically necessary therapy services for children with conditions eligible for the California Children's Services (CCS) Medical Therapy Program (MTP) are linked together in the provision of services to children with disabilities by the California Government Code, Chapter 26.5, and the interagency regulations (2 CCR 60000 – 60610) effective August 1999.

IDEIA holds education responsible to work cooperatively with other public and private agencies to assure that children with disabilities receive education and related services as identified in the IEP or IFSP. One method of meeting this responsibility is the use of interagency agreements which specify each agency's responsibility for the provision of special education and related services.

Review of Interagency Agreement

This agreement will be reviewed annually. Changes will be made as necessary by new legislation or other factors. No additions, deletions, or modifications may be made to this agreement without the joint, written approval of the parties to the agreement.

This document is in effect until replaced by a revised Interagency Agreement signed by all parties.

1. GENERAL	
SELPA/LEA	CCS
<p>Shall provide the appropriate education program and environment for students with exceptional needs according to their Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).</p> <p>Shall assure that the services provided by teachers, specialists and personnel in the school settings are in accordance with State certification requirements and professional ethics.</p>	<p>Shall provide medically necessary physical and/or occupational therapy services under medical supervision to students according to Children's Medical Services/California Children Services (CCS) policies and state and federal law related to children with disabilities.</p> <p>Shall assure that the services provided by physicians, physical therapists and/or occupational therapists are in accordance with State licensure or national certification and professional ethics.</p> <p>Will apply the laws, regulations, standards and guidelines governing Children's Medical Services/CCS when providing services to eligible children and as appropriate, California Education Code (EC) and IDEIA related to children with exceptional needs with Individual Education Program (IEPs) or Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSPs).</p>
2. FISCAL/ADMINISTRATION [2 CCR 60310 (c) (1), (13), (d) (1) - (2)]	
SELPA/LEA	CCS
<p>Shall jointly determine with CCS, the CMS Branch and CDE the need for and location of MTU/satellites, and shall jointly conduct planning for new or relocated sites. Prior to relocation, the MTU therapy staff must be given at least 60 days from the date of the agreement to be moved. The LEA is responsible for moving the equipment to a new location. Equipment at new or relocated sites must be in place and operational prior to therapy services be resumed.</p> <p>Responsible for the provision, maintenance and operation of the facility housing the MTU during the CCS work day on a twelve month basis; and,</p> <p>The provision and maintenance of necessary space, equipment and supplies as agreed upon jointly with CCS.</p> <p>The SELPA Administrator or LEA designee shall be the liaison to the local Children's Medical Services/CCS program to coordinate services between Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA)/Local Education Agency (LEA) and the Medical Therapy Program (MTP). CCS staff is responsible for preparing the MTU or satellite equipment or supplies for moving. 3. REFERRAL [2 CCR 60610 (c) (2)]

<p><u>Referral of Children to CCS</u></p> <p>Shall refer students, birth to 21 years of age, to the local Children's Medical Services/CCS program when there is a suspected need for medically necessary physical and/or occupational therapy services. This includes students who may have or are suspected of having a neuromuscular, musculoskeletal or other physical impairment which may require medically necessary occupational therapy or physical therapy, or other conditions that may require Children's Medical Services/CCS intervention.</p> <p>Shall refer students who were former clients of Children's Medical Services/CCS for whom there is suspected need for medically necessary physical and/or occupational therapy services.</p> <p><u>Referral for Special Education</u></p> <p>Shall accept referrals from Children's Medical Services/CCS of students suspected of needing special education services and/or assessment under IDEIA or other state and federal laws and/or services under Rehabilitation Act, Section 504.</p>	<p><u>Referral of Children to CCS</u></p> <p>Shall accept referrals from the SELPA/LEA of students suspected of needing medically necessary physical and/or occupational therapy services. This includes students who may have or are suspected of having a neuromuscular, musculoskeletal or other physical impairment which may require medically necessary occupational therapy or physical therapy, or other conditions that may require Children's Medical Services/CCS intervention.</p> <p><u>Referral for Special Education</u></p> <p>Shall refer the student receiving service from Children's Medical Services/CCS and suspected of needing special education services and/or assessment under IDEIA or other law/codes and/or services under Rehabilitation Act, Section 504, consideration to the SELPA/LEA.</p>
4. EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION [2 CCR 60610 (c)(3) - (5); 34 CFR 300.500]	
SELPA/LEA	CCS
<p>Will exchange educational and medical information between the SELPA/LEA and CCS regarding students with disabilities upon receiving the parent's written, informed consent in accordance to 34 CFR 300.500.</p> <p>Will provide supporting medical information, signed parent/legal guardian consent to exchange information between agencies and a Children's Medical Services/CCS application.</p> <p>Shall provide ten (10) days notice to the Children's Medical Services/CCS program of all IEP team meetings for those students eligible for the MTP. (Notice will include who is expected to attend the IEP meeting.)</p> <p>Will send a copy of the IEP to the MTU when Children's Medical Services/CCS medically necessary therapy services, as stated in the proposed/approved therapy plan, and/or transportation to the therapy site are included in the IEP/IFSP.</p>	<p>Will exchange educational and medical information between the SELPA/LEA and CCS regarding students with disabilities upon receiving the parent's written, informed consent in accordance to 34 CFR 300.500.</p> <p>Will forward a copy of the assessment report of the therapy and proposed/approved therapy plan to the SELPA/LEA and parent within sixty (60) days of signed consent.</p> <p>Will give ten (10) days notice to the SELPA/LEA of the MTP of those students referred by the SELPA/LEA for medically necessary therapy services of the initiation or change in approved therapy plans which may necessitate a change in the IEP. This will serve as the notice to the SELPA/LEA of the possible initiation or change in a student's approved therapy plan or IEP.</p> <p>Will receive a copy of the IEP when Children's Medical Services/CCS medically necessary therapy services as stated in the proposed/approved therapy plan and/or transportation to the therapy site are included in the IEP/IFSP.</p>

<p>EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION (CONT.) May send an education representative, with the consent of parent/legal guardian to the MTC for the purpose of sharing information. The SELPA/LEA shall notify the MTP in advance of the education staff member who will attend the MTC.</p>	
5. ASSESSMENT EVALUATION

<p>An assessment plan will be developed and given to the parent/guardian within fifteen (15) calendar days of the referral date.</p> <p>Shall evaluate students according to the assessment requirements of Federal and State laws.</p> <p>Review/evaluation of the IEP goals and objectives will be completed no less than once each calendar year.</p>	<p>Within thirty (30) days an occupational therapy or physical therapy evaluation and review of medical records will be completed.</p> <p>Shall determine medical eligibility and evaluate those students for medically necessary physical therapy and/or occupational therapy in accordance with State Children's Medical Services/CCS policies.</p> <p>Review of the treatment plan, including goals and objectives, will be completed on a six (6) month basis for active clients and a one (1) year basis for those on monitor status.</p>

**7. INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT (IEP)

SELPA/LEA	CCS
<p>The SELPA/LEA will convene an IEP meeting to determine if the medically necessary therapy services documented in the therapy plan are necessary for the student to benefit from special education and should, therefore, be included in the IEP.</p> <p>Shall provide a ten (10) day advance notice to local Children's Medical Services/CCS of the IEP/IFSP Team meeting for students who have been referred or are receiving medically necessary physical and/or occupational therapy services.</p> <p>IEP/IFSP meeting times shall be arranged to allow participation of Children's Medical Services/CCS as appropriate to meet the student's needs.</p> <p>Development and review of the IEP/IFSP shall reflect a coordinated approach between related curriculum and services, including the MOVE curriculum goals and the Children's Medical Services/CCS approved treatment plan.</p> <p>Development and amending of therapy services on a student's IEP shall be in accordance with requirements of EC 56341.</p>	<p>Will designate an MTU therapist/designee to attend IEP meetings when requested by SELPA/LEA. The participation of the MTU therapist in the IEP meeting will be limited to the discussion of the MTP program services that will assist the student in reaching maximum physical potential for functional skills necessary to participate in school activities.</p> <p>Shall participate in the IEP/IFSP meeting in accordance with the State Children's Medical Services/CCS program policies and Government Code 7572 (e).</p> <p>Shall provide a therapy summary and approved treatment plan for inclusion in the IEP/IFSP with parent consent.</p> <p>Children's Medical Services/CCS participation in the IEP/IFSP shall reflect a coordinated approach between related curriculum and services, including the MOVE curriculum goals, and the Children's Medical Services/CCS approved treatment plan.</p> <p>Participate as appropriate in the development and amending of therapy services on a student's IEP in accordance with EC 53341.</p>

8. LEAST RESTRICTIVE ENVIRONMENT

<p>Shall insure that, to the maximum extent appropriate, students with exceptional needs are educated in the least restrictive environment.</p> <p>Shall insure that placement outside of the general education environment occurs only when the severity of the disability is such that the education in general education classes, with the use of supplementary aids and services, cannot be achieved satisfactorily.</p>	<p>Shall cooperate with the SELPA/LEA in managing how the student's physical needs are met in the least restrictive environment</p>

9. HOUSING [2 CCR 60310 (c) (9), (10); (d) (3)]	
SELPA/LEA	CCS

<p>Shall provide the required therapeutic and office equipment identified by State Children's Medical Services/CCS for a primary MTU on school grounds, and shall replace equipment as necessary.</p> <p>Equipment purchased by the SELPA/LEA shall remain the property of the SELPA/LEA.</p> <p>Shall provide office supplies in accordance with educational protocol allotted the educational staff.</p> <p>Shall establish a plan for the cooperative use of materials and equipment by the school and MTU and therapy satellites.</p> <p>Shall establish an annual budget for supplies and equipment used by the MTU.</p>	<p>Shall determine the therapeutic equipment needs of the MTU and therapy satellite in accordance with the State Children's Medical Services/CCS policy.</p> <p>Shall provide supplies and equipment as agreed upon jointly with SELPA.</p> <p>Shall establish a plan for the cooperative use of materials and equipment by the school and MTU and therapy satellites.</p> <p>Shall submit to the SELPA/LEA an annual budget recommendation for expendable educational supplies, repair, replacement and purchase of new therapeutic equipment and office supplies.</p> <p>Shall provide expendable therapeutic supplies.</p> <p>Shall provide and maintain medically necessary equipment for the sole use of a student in accordance with the Children's Medical Services/CCS program policies.</p> <p>Shall identify unsafe and defective equipment used by Children/s Medical Services/CCS clients.</p>

<p>EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES (CONT.)</p> <p>Shall provide transportation to the therapy or satellite site in accordance with the IEP/IFSP.</p>	<p>Shall not be responsible for the student's transportation to or from the therapy or satellite site during or after school hours.</p> <p>Shall assure supervision of the student during the scheduled therapy appointment at the primary MTU or the therapy satellite.</p>
12. PROVISION OF SERVICES

15. HOLD HARMLESS	
SELPA/LEA	CCS
<p>SELPA/LEA agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Children's Medical Services/CCS and its employees against any liability arising from the acts or omissions of Children's Medical Services/CCS, its agents or employees while performing services under this agreement.</p>	<p>Children's Medical Services/CCS agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SELPA/LEA and its employees against any liability arising from the acts or omissions of the SELPA/LEA, its agents or employees while performing services under this agreement.</p>

16. STAFF DEVELOPMENT [2 CCR 606/10 (c) (11)]

<p>(a) In order to facilitate the provision of services described in subdivisions (a), (b), (d), and (e) of Section 7572 of the Government Code and subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) of Section 7575 of the Government Code, each independent county agency and each authorized dependent county agency of CCS shall appoint a liaison for the county agency of CCS. The county Superintendent of Schools or SELPA director shall ensure the designation of a liaison for each SELPA in each local plan.</p> <p>(b) In the event of multi-SELPA counties or multi-county SELPAs, the liaisons representing education and CCS shall develop a process for interagency decision making that results in a local interagency agreement.</p>

(3) Exchanging between the agencies the educational and medical information concerning the pupil with a disability upon receiving the parent's written, informed consent obtained in accordance with Section 300.500 of Title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations. (4) Giving 10 days notice to the county CCS agency of all IEP team meetings for pupils served by CCS medical therapy program; (5) Giving 10 days notice to the LEA and the parent of an impending change in the CCS medical therapy program services which may necessitate a change in the IEP; (6) Describing the methods of participation of CCS in the IEP team meetings pursuant to Government Code Section 7572(e); (7) Developing or amending the therapy services indicated in the pupil's IEP in accordance with Section 56341 of the Education Code; (8) Transporting pupils with disabilities to receive medically-necessary occupational therapy or physical therapy services at the medical therapy unit or medical therapy unit satellite; (9) Determining the need for and location of medical therapy units or medical therapy unit satellites, or other off-site facilities authorized by state CCS and the California Department of Education; (10) Approving the utilization of designated therapy space when not in use by CCS staff.
